'ה then told him to throw the bar of gold into the fire, give it one blow with the hammer, and a finished מנורה would emerge! משה threw the gold into the fire, hit it with the hammer and Davened to 'ה. Immediately, the complete מנורה emerged from the fire.

The question is; if 'ה knew that משה was not going to be able to actually make the מנורה by himself, why did He show him the heavenly vision first?

In order to get anywhere in life, you need to have a goal; a vision of where you are heading. You have to first know what you want, before it can happen. Similarly, you can't daven and expect סייעתא דשמיא if you don't have a clear vision of what you are looking for. Therefore, 'n had to show משה a vision of what he was supposed to accomplish, and only then could daven for 's's Help in making the מנורה.

The Alter of Kelm explains how the צדיקים of previous generations became such great people. It was because they knew the power of setting goals, and had visions of what they aspired to reach. In order to really change, one needs to envision the great person he would like to be. When Rav Akiva Eiger was asked how he became who he was, he replied that he strove to become like the ראשונים (one of the great ראשונים) who lived hundreds of years before him), and therefore he was able to become Rav Eiger.

A person should always have high goals and keep aiming higher. We have seen this throughout the school this term as our girls all sat exams and put in a huge amount of effort to push themselves higher, to achieve more.

It has been a pleasure watching our girls aim higher this term, from exams to fundraising and more. None of us will ever forget year 10 and year 11 fundraising for school, the excitement was palpable as they kept hitting their target and then went on to set a higher target. Between the two year groups they raised over £20,000 (once it had been doubled). We are so proud of them!

We have seen girls revising all over the school, hearing feedback from many parents how hard their daughters worked, and seeing the girls perform so well in the exam hall.

We are looking forward to the next half term with further learning and אדר activities.

Year 10 Shabbaton




Safeguarding and Mental Health Sessions


