A message from Rabbi Wilson שליט"א

סגולה מכל העמים

When they were expecting their first child, Rav Chaim Pinchas Scheinberg זצ"ל and his wife travelled to Radin to meet the Chofetz Chaim and seek a ברכה. The Chofetz Chaim was already an old man and hard-of-hearing, so his gabbai would shout into his ear to introduce new visitors.

The gabbai said in a loud voice that this young man (Rav Scheinberg) deserves an extra ברכה, because he and his wife had come all the way from America to learn in Mir. The Chofetz Chaim replied that this was nothing special – if the שמים can come all the way from שמים to give us the תורה, a young man should be prepared to travel from America to Europe to receive it!

Although this story ends with the Chofetz Chaim giving a heartfelt the young couple, Rav Scheinberg would often recall this story for the Chofetz Chaim's strong message to him (I personally heard him tell this story to a large gathering on visit to London in his later years).

But what is the deeper message behind the Chofetz Chaim's blunt reply? Surely the Chofetz Chaim wasn't trying to tell Rav Scheinberg that 'adid not value his efforts?

On the contrary! The Chofetz Chaim was telling Rav Scheinberg just how important our מצות are. He was saying this: if you want to know how important your מצות are, instead of thinking about how much you have done for 'ה, think about how much He has done for you. Why did הי create this whole world? Why did He create people? Why did He come all the way from שמים to give us the תורה, taking the trouble to write it in words that even children can read and understand?

There is one answer to all these questions: because He loves and values our מצות. That's why Hashem describes us in this week's סדרה as His סגולה מכל העמים—His greatest treasure in the world. He treasures our מצות, our תפלות, our עבודת המדות.

If we understood how treasured we are in 'ה's eyes and how much He values our מצות, we would run across the world (from America to Europe and beyond) for anything that would help us do more מצות, or learn more.

Recently, Torah Umesorah brought over a Rov from Lakewood whose expertise is explaining to teens and young adults how it can be proven that תורה is true. The girls enjoyed his presentation, but what I enjoyed more than anything was witnessing first-hand how impressed and inspired he was by our girls – by their sincerity and deep desire to do what is right and to grow.

The first topic is privacy and security, discussing passwords, scams and hackers, and the importance of keeping personal information private.
